  - 6.2 Course Curriculum
    - Level 1- changes were presented and approved: CIS 253; ECO 201 & 202; LPN 141, 143, 151, & 189; WPE 231; RP Program Description
    - Level 3 changes – were presented New degree & courses ECE AAS program and ECE Courses 101, 115, 130, 140, 160, 190, 208, 210, 211, 215, 250, 275, 278, 278 and 289. Course in activations: ART 273 and LEN 110.
    - Level 3 Deadline Discussion – Two concerns were raised by faculty:
      - Unilateral due date changes without faculty, C&CC, or ALC input over the summer or 2025. Chairs/directors/faculty were not told of the due date changes until it was too late to meet the new dates for Fall 2026. Courses & curriculum will discuss at the next meeting.
      - The length of time it takes to get level 3 courses approved for courses that run once a year can potentially take two years to get approved.
