Priority Updates

— Enrollment Management

- Following Batch Cancel, enrollment dropped 9.5% working hard to reenroll the dropped students. Also sent out e-mail blast for upcoming Aug 1 Fall "Done in a Day" event.
- University Center
 - If you know of good prospects for University Center let Craig Jbara know Goal is to attract partnerships with programs that benefit students in both venues.
- Early College
 - 4th week of summer camps going well.
 - Hiring a part time early college mentor for Fall.
- Retention
 - Completed e-mail outreach encouraging specifically identified students to take more credits – preliminary two week results show some limited positive results.
 - A committee of key stakeholders has been formed to develop targeted outreach to returning students cancelled for batch.
- International Students
 - For Fall 2018 we have 40 F1 students and 10 transfers from WMU.
 - The college is beginning the interview process for replacing Diane Finch.
- Life Long Learning
 - Please forward new ideas for programing to Craig Jbara
- Diversity and Inclusion
 - How does KVCC respond to Papa John's CEO behavior? Discussed importance of an inclusive and open environment.

- Following the regular Administrators Plus meeting a 2019 KPI development workshop was held. At the conclusion of the discussion the support areas participating agreed that operational areas of the college are vital to achieving student success and ALL of the college-level KPI focus areas. However it may be difficult to find quantitative measures that clearly tie to the collegelevel KPIs. Descriptive measures of performance may be more meaningful to use.
- For the 2019 KPI process, support areas may develop KPIs that focus on one initiative or describe how what they do operationally connects across ALL College level focus areas or the strategic value of college. Support area KPIs may be descriptive or quantitative. The goal is to have all areas of the college participate in the KPI dialogue and process.
