1. Review/Approve Minutes from November 7, 2018

2. Welcome and Introduction
 - Welcomed new Provost/VP for instruction and student services – Dr. Peter Linden
 - Introductions of returning and new members
3. Perkins
 - Patti Henning gave updates regarding Perkins funding, regulations and new requirements.
 - Distributed required surveys
4. Announcements
 - CIS participated in KVCC 1st Annual Skilled Trades Expo
 - Over 800 people attended, 300 prospect student cards filled out.
 - CIS is working with KVCC Marketing to start a new campaign for marketing the CIS programs and Cisco Program
 - Geofencing and WWMT Career Source has been a successful Link to watch: <https://wwmt.com/news/local/career-source-kvcc-trains-students-for-computer-science-careers>
 - KVCC will be moving from Moodle to hosted Canvas for LMS
 - Tim Welsh shared that Piloting will begin winter 2019 and by fall 2020 KVCC will be 100% canvas.
5. Program Updates (Not sure if notes are all underneath the correct agenda items)
 - Python course being offered Winter 2020
 - Cisco program adjusting to 3 courses
 - CCENT going away July 31, 2020 New CCNA Exam objectives will begin March 1 2020. Cisco CCNA is moving from 4 courses to 3 courses – a lot of the Advanced features will be moved to CCNP courses.
 - Meeting in November to preview new curriculum.
 - Intro to Web Application Programming to be offered in Fall 2020

- Ed Freed sees the demand for more software developer skills especially using C# and incorporating more Application Program Interfaces (APIs) into development.
- Brian Wright agreed with the demand for more software developers – Bronson currently has 3 developers. They see the demand for Web Developers and C# programming skills
- Advanced Web Programming to be offered in Winter 2021
- Developing new Cybersecurity course to be offered Fall 2020
 - Ethical hacker course will be piloted in Fall 2020 and prepare students for taking the Certified Ethical Hacker(CEH) Certification
 - Chris Gearig will send out an email with the master syllabus when it has been updated.
 - Davenport has a new cyber security program and received a grant for 4.5 million dollars in scholarship for students – this is good opportunity for KVCC students to take part in Davenport's program with our 3+1 program.
 - Western Michigan University is adding new bachelors program for cyber security (Fall 2019 launch). WMU currently has a Master's program in Cyber Security
- Proposal to remove the CIS 298 Mobile Apps course
 - Mobile Apps is being taught using Android and Java.
 - Google is moving away from Java to a language called Kotlin that still runs on the Java Virtual Machine.
 - KVCC currently does not teach Kotlin
 - Google's long term would like to move away from the Java Virtual Machine all together to get out from under Oracle and is currently developing another language called Flutter.
 - The rapid technology changes will make it very difficult for KVCC to stay current if we continue to teach this course.
 - In addition, it is a very challenging topic. In WMU's Computer Science department it is a graduate level course.
