HVAC Advisory Board Meeting Minutes

- 1. Lunch at 11:00 am.
- 2. Pro-Review Surveys handed out to board members to be filled out.
- 3. Started the meeting at 11:15 am.
- 4. Luke Vanderhill motioned to approve minutes of the last meeting and Sheldon Smith seconded it.
- 5. Student numbers were impacted by tuition hike plus the general trend is downward. a. We are currently not attracting enough students
 - b. Gehry thinks we need more advertising and visit schools to promote our program
- 6. LaJoyce Brooks said there is grant money available in October (\$100 million) for companies to set up apprenticeships to attract people into the trades.
 - a. Companies will have to write a grant to get this funding and there are state mandates that must be met for this apprenticeship. Minimum total contact hours are 577 hours.
 - b. Luke commented that these grants have a minimum age requirements (18 Yr or older) and limits companies from hiring high school students for summer help.
 - c. LaJoyce will check into the 18 yr limitations and see if there is a waiver program.
 - d. Dan Wood is interested in seeing a written procedure on how to write a grant for this program. Can KVCC do this for us?
- 7. Monica Koning, our school internship coordinator, says there are currently 68 internships in progress but every few are in HVAC.
 - a. She would like to spend more time with HVAC program to help attract more students into the internship program.
 - b. Gehry says he has offered or encouraged student in the past to look into this but has sparked little interest.
 - c. Monica did mention that internships in some programs are optional and in others are required.
 - d. Luke asked why it is not required in HVAC
 - e. To do an internship the student must be 75% complete in the program before starting to make contacts in industry.
 - f. Monica says she helps students write resumes and hone interview skills.

- 8. The "Ride Along Program" has sparked interest with board members.
 - a. Gehry says it gives students an opportunity to see what it is like to be a technician and encourage students to pursue the HVAC program.
 - b. This should be done at the freshman level with an written policy and procedure in place.
- 9. Dwight discussed the results of the ESCO Readiness Test & EPA
 - a. Handed out a printed slide presentation and discussed the various slides
 - b. The average of the students that took the readiness test dropped from last year but were still higher than the national averages.
 - c. EPA 608 test results were 16 universal and 2 less than universal
 - d. Now that KVCC proctors the test and the cost to the students dropped in half.
- 10. The Heat Pump class presentation will be Tuesday, April 21, from 5:00 6:50 pm in room 5830 and we encourage contractors to sit in on these presentations.
- 11. Our call volume has increased in contractors, maintenance organizations, head hunters, etc. looking for graduates to hire.
 - a. Dwight commented that Ferris State is having difficulties finding students for their 4 year program.
 - b. Reports back from Ferris indicated our KVCC transfer students are well prepared for the work required in their 4 year program.
- 12. We have done a couple of field trips this year.
 - a. Gehry is asking if there are any projects that would make a good field trip, please let him know.
 - b. Luke says he might have a possible field trip candidate on installing boilers for radiate floor heat, etc.
