Health Careers Program Admission Ranking Criteria





Ranking Criteria:

- 1. In order to apply to a KVCC Health Careers Program, students must complete all prerequisite courses, each with a 2.0 or better grade.
- 2. All prerequisite Science and Math (HCR, BIO, CHM and MATH) courses must be completed within 7 years of the Health Careers Program application deadline.
- 3. Exceptions to rules can only be determined by the Program Director in consultation with the Dean.
