 - Current exhibits are Ray Harryhausen (first time in the US for this exhibit) open until April 27, mini-exhibit on Kalamazoo local masonic history open through June, Colorful Collections and Art of Advertising exhibits open through August 31.
 - Upcoming exhibits on the third floor are Wallace & Gromit and Shaun the Sheep for summer, Dancing with Life Mexican Masks for fall, Houdini Unlocked for winter. Coming later are Dinosaurs, Toytopia (third floor and first floor exhibit spaces), KVM anniversary exhibit.
 - Upcoming exhibits for the first floor are Am I An American or Am I Not?, Black Cowboys: An American Story (inspired by Murphy Darden), likely KVCC anniversary exhibit.
 - Working with Douglass Community Center to help each other expand 2nd floor exhibit/programming.
 - Strategic planning follow-up will be happening regarding tasks/feedback for MAT.
