- 5. Info-share Updates:
 - a. Allied Health
 - i. Great progress has been made regarding the credit side of Surg Tech
 - ii. Plan is to develop a collaborative credit/non-credit package for stakeholders involving AAS in Surg Tech as well as noncredit pathways for Endo Tech, Sterile Processing, etc.
 - b. Culinary
 - i. Advisory board meeting held at TTC/Zoom last Friday; successful other than a few technical glitches. Next meeting will be at CAH.
 - ii. Food for Thought Competition has 9 applications in (as of 3/10); five finalists will move on to meet with/be paired with Kalsec scientist.
 - iii. New culinary curriculum classes continue to be rolled out.
 - iv. Working with Rachel and Ben to incorporate events/FIC/ValleyHUB into CUL classes.
 - c. Sustainable Food Systems
 - i. NK Website development: on schedule for early May website launch. Currently working with designers to finalize design; writing content.
 - ii. [March 21 event at CAH](#): training for farmers/producers who are interested in selling to Early Care and Education sites. Presented in partnership with MDARD, MSUE, and others.
 - 1. This is a pilot of the type of programming we will offer through the Local Food Promotion Program grant - Crystal's new role.
 - iii. [Foodways Symposium](#) - virtual events in the evenings April 5-8; in-person "Foodways Festival" outdoors at FIC on April 9.
 - iv. [Food Hub Operations Coordinator](#) position posted through 3/20.
 - v. [Local Food Procurement Assistance Cooperative Agreement Program](#): we are confirmed to receive a sub-award in the Michigan statewide proposal. We plan to partner with Kalamazoo Loaves & Fishes, Milestone Senior Services, and Sprout BC for sure, and we will have some flexibility to work with other organizations to distribute food, especially aligned with healthcare or education programming. I would like to have a launch meeting in April/May. [Proposal materials](#).
 - vi. Garden Education project developments:
 - 1. We are identifying organizations with existing gardens, or desire to start gardens, with education and food security goals, and looking at ways to support them:
 - a. Planning to host a cohort of up to 12 Y.O.U. MyCity youth interns at FIC and bring them to organization gardens for work days over the summer

- b. Requesting a small KV Foundation grant to help with garden supplies
 - c. Looking at offering a "Garden Leadership Academy" program, probably in the fall through FIC LE.
 - d. Garden partners usually want to offer cooking/nutrition/food prep workshops in the garden.
 - 2. Douglass Community Association is one active partner; several churches also. Planning to share about the project with Northside Ministerial Alliance on March 22.
 - 3. YWCA and Kalamazoo Literacy Council reached out to Delia and Sara to discuss writing KVCC into a Michigan Health Endowment Fund grant. Initial meeting 3/14, will report out and pull others in as needed (but request to Delia/Sara indicates they are interested in garden programming primarily)

 - i. February 8 - August 18: SNAP Ed culinary and nutrition direct education (Middle and High School Youth). Weekly complementary groceries and *virtual* class. 4 cohorts, 6 sessions/cohort. Partnership with Bronson Healthcare Group. Funded by Bronson Health Foundation, Michigan Fitness Foundation and SNAP.
 - ii. March 31: Hybrid culinary session support for Foodways Symposium Chef Claudia cooking class.
 - 1. Food requisition, procurement and prep.
 - 2. Collaborating with IT to train on/deliver hybrid session for culinary students/staff.
