B. Grants Update

Lumina Foundation Prioritizing Adult Community College Enrollment (PACCE) Grant – Awarded \$75,000 Two Year Grant

Funds a project to build a sustainable outreach and enrollment model that embeds our institutional presence within community organizations frequented by adults to promote college opportunities and simplify the enrollment process. This grant opportunity also includes support from Achieve the Dream to coach and guide our staff and offers an opportunity to connect with peer institutions who are implementing similar strategies.

Evan Pauken and Megan Pauken are the primary grant coordinators. A small team has already attended a series of Behavioral Science Training sessions to kick off the project.

Aramark Building Community Grant – Awarded \$2,500 one-time grant

Fund the Valley Food Share program for holiday distributions. Additionally, the Aramark staff will volunteer their time to assist with holiday distributions.

Beth Wolfe (Aramark) is the primary grant coordinator.

Association of Community College Trustees and Education Strategy Group Noncredit and Credit Alignment Lab (NCAL) – Two year cohort project with \$3,000 - \$10,000 stipend to cover data collection costs

Our proposal was not selected.

NACUBO Strategic Finance for Student Success Grant – Three year cohort project with \$10,000 annual stipend for participation plus \$1500 provided annually to cover travel expenses to attend NACUBO annual meeting.

Our proposal was selected to move on to the second round of the application process. This grant project is designed to bring together higher education leaders and campus-based finance leaders to develop a framework to ensure that impactful pilot projects or grant-funded initiatives are fully integrated into campus financial planning processes early, and that positive outcomes are financially and operationally sustainable. This project is specifically targeting institutions who serve at least 40% Pell-eligible students, and are leveraging Guided Pathways or Tackling Transfer practices to improve student outcomes.

National Endowment for the Arts, Creative Forces Community Engagement Grant - \$15,000 onetime matching funds grant

To support funding for a live performance of Modern Warrior on campus in November 2022. Additional funds from other sponsors, foundations, etc. would be needed to cover the additional funds needed.

Grant application is due December 15, 2021.
