Award

The Okun Foundation - \$35,000 for 2023 to fund Valley Food Share

Advancing Community Equity & Upward Mobility (ACE-UP) Community of Practice Opportunity

The Corporation for a Skilled Workforce, with support from the Lumina Foundation, is pulling together a cohort of 20-25 community colleges and their industry partners in a first of its kind community of practice. The project seeks to address growing postsecondary and labor market disparities by bringing together community college and industry leaders to design and scale strategies to increase access to employment and advance employment outcomes for people of color. Kalamazoo Valley has submitted a proposal for the health careers programs (along with Bronson Health) to be a part of this project. If selected, the college will receive peer support and dedicated attention from experts to review current practices and to help the college become a best-practices institution.
