- a. Reported on the following *Personnel* items:

Approval of Minutes

The Cabinet approved the minutes of the Sept. 7, 2010 meeting as presented.

Other

- o The external auditors are on campus working to prepare the FY 2010 audit.
- o Briefly reviewed a graph of a time line for technology innovations prepared by Gartner Research.
- It was agreed that auditorium rental and equipment fees can be waived for memorial services for employees/retirees who have passed away – however, any other costs, such as food or other rental fees separate from the memorial service itself, would be applicable. It was also agreed that the facility rental guidelines/procedures manual will be updated to reflect this change.
- o Reported that a recommendation to contract with *Energy Education* to implement an energy conservation program at KVCC is on the September Board agenda.
- o KVCC's annual "Constitution Day" is scheduled for September 17.
- Heard a brief report on middle colleges and KVCC's possible involvement.
- o Mentioned that community colleges may soon be required to post budget information on the Internet. This is already a requirement for all K-12 schools in Michigan.
- Agreed that Dan Maley and Lauren Beresford will take the lead on establishing KVCC's sustainability committee.
- Reminded the Cabinet that reports on our planning/priorities will be need to be reviewed by the Cabinet before the October Board meeting.

o In FY 2008/09, more than 20% of students served resided in the western Michigan region outside of Kalamazoo County.

Review of Our Data Collection Efforts and Discussion on "Achieving the Dream"

Kathy Johnson shared a brief update on the types data needed for various grants. Questions were raised regarding the prioritization of grants – some of the top areas we are considering for grants include developmental education, alternative energy, food processing and preparation/culinary, security, and health care. Kathy mentioned that funding opportunities could be enhanced when we collaborate with other colleges; collaboration is becoming more of a requirement.

Kathy shared a brief overview of the "Achieving the Dream" initiative which reinforced the need for our continued efforts on data collection and to document student success rates.
