Dockerty discussed the recommendation of adding 3-3-0 (Blended) and 3-0-0 (Online) to PSI 102, State & Local Government, 3-3-0 (Lecture/Discussion) stating this addition was initially made to accommodate a special MAT² offering.  - Health Sciences General Studies, AAS This new program was created with the implementation of the competitive admissions process when guaranteed entry into a health career program could no longer be met. This new program of study is transferrable to WMU healthcare studies and provides multiple options for those who are not successful in a health career program. Electives chosen fit with health careers courses. Health Care program directors support this program of study. This new program will need to be approved through the Higher Learning Commission. After discussion it was MOVED, SECONDED, and CARRIED, with one abstention (D. Bertch), to recommend the addition of Health Sciences General Studies, AAS as a new program offering at KVCC.
 - 5.6.2 General Automotive Service, Certificate This new program is a streamlined entry level "go-to-work" program that includes state certification. This new program is a natural fit with Guided Pathways, helps with completion numbers, and is employer driven. The first two semesters are transferable to an AAS program or provides a go-to-work experience while maintaining the quality of the program. D. Martin and K. Sparrow will work together on aligning course prerequisites. After discussion it was MOVED, SECONDED, and CARRIED to recommend the addition of General Automotive Service, Certificate as a new program offering at KVCC.

ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE

All students seeking admission into a Health Careers program of study (Dental Hygiene, Emergency Medical Services, Medical Assistant Technology, Nursing, Nursing RN Completion, or Respiratory Care Practitioner) will initially, be placed in the Health Sciences General Studies, AAS program of study. Once a student is accepted into a focused health career program he/she will be transferred from the Health Sciences General Studies, AAS program of study into the focused program of study (Dental Hygiene, Emergency Medical Services, Medical Assistant Technology, Nursing, Nursing RN Completion, or Respiratory Care Practitioner) and assigned the associated program code.
