- **RAVE/ALERTUS: NOTIFICATIONS OF EMERGENCIES**

- RAVE

- Who receives RAVE notices

- Students

- Per Mike Thompson, students are “bulk imported” to system; automatically receive RAVE notices

- Employees

- ? “opt in” v. “opt out”
 - Mike Thompson following up
 - Discussion re: coverage at New Employee Orientation
 - Aaron Hilliard to send Orientation agenda to committee
 - Discussion re: holding well publicized (at Summit; KVFocus+; Friday Info Message) “test” with instructions
 - If don’t receive RAVE test, go to <https://www.getrave.com/login/kvcc> to sign up

- ALERTUS

- Icon on computers/laptops to alert of emergency situation

- If activated via lap top, location would shown office of owner, not necessarily location of issue if owner is out of office

- Discussion of whether notification would be received should individual be teaching, in zoom meeting, etc.

- Per Aaron Snead

- Most if not all front-line areas are activated

- Per Sean/Aaron Snead, RAVE/ALERTUS systems can activate messaging on the other

- Currently ALERTUS is “activator”

- Further discussion is needed

- Phones

- Can notify of alert via phone call

- Cannot receive alerts

- Extremely expensive

- Information to be gathered re: both systems and discussed at next meeting

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- **AREA LEADER**
 - Function is to get staff out/organized/communicate appropriately with Public Safety
 - Facilities Services staff does second sweep and advises “all clear”
 - List of area leaders is being compiled
 - Training/orientation to follow
 - Radios will be kept in central location within each area
 - Per Dannie, radios are being compiled; will have access to only 1 channel for Public Safety
- **ACTIVE SHOOTER/SITUATIONAL AWARENESS WALK THROUGH**
 - Open sessions to be scheduled
 - Scheduling directly with departments is much more inclusive and effective
 - Please reach out to schedule; 1 hour or less; can combine areas if schedules permit
 - Situational awareness walk throughs take place after active shooter training
- **EMERGENCY RESPONSE VIDEOS**
 - Cover several topics
 - In process; will be uploaded to Public Safety site
 - Suggestion made to place reference/?link to Public Safety site on KVCC main page
- **HALLWAY MAPS BEING REVISED (TOM HAMMAN)**
 - Needed to relocate some Emergency Shelters
 - Discussion re: global “unlock” areas in case of emergency situations
 - Per Sean, Greg Pestun working on ability to do so via swipe

ALARM/VIDEO SECURITY CAMERA UPDATE

- **TTC**
 - Majority of external cameras replaced
 - Several blue emergency phones being replaced due to cameras being installed at their locations
- Other campus camera replacement to follow
- **AWH**
 - Re-alarmed; notifications are now audible continuously; new strobe function added

CRITICAL INCIDENT MAPPING UPDATE

- Project supported by State funding
- Provides local law enforcement (Kalamazoo City; MSP; County) entities with maps identifying specific locations within buildings
- Mapping completed; training (by state organization) pending

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TRAINING

- Michigan now requiring 24 hours of annual public safety officer training
 - 16 hours, department choice; 8 hours (de-escalation focus) required by state
- On-line training modules (approved by the state) available
- Security officers also receiving training, including CPR certification
- Citizens Academy
 - Offered by West MI Training Consortium; Apr/Oct
 - Scenario-based: ride along; shooting range; etc.
 - Advise Sean if interested

OPEN DISCUSSION

- Process for students in transit who may be unaware of active situation
 - Possibly incorporate into Orientation
 - Paige to follow up
 - RAVE
 - Specific-incident/scenario training
