CMOP 3090

Authorized Educational Use of Alcohol

The use (purchase, sale, manufacture, sample tasting, serving, and disposal) of alcohol in activities related to the teaching of KVCC culinary and brewing courses is permitted. The course must be under the supervision of a culinary or brewing instructor, and the beverage must be a legal one as defined by the Michigan Liquor Control Act. This includes activities and events associated with the teaching brewery, culinary teaching kitchens, teaching restaurant, and cafe. The Chief Academic Officer will be responsible for overseeing the safety, security, and inventory control procedures related to the use of alcohol for teaching purposes.
