#### IR Update

- Winter Enrollment
  - Currently down, but is early in process
  - EMC registration is next week
- Program Enrollment Data/10-year Total Head Count Change
  - Previous request made to review data (for past 5 years) per program area to see where declines have occurred
  - o Pulled "program of record" as found in Banner
  - o Only "for credit programs" (career academies not included)
  - Discussion highlights
    - Reflects "program of record"
      - Some students have multiple programs in record
        - Stop outs/returners do not always change programs
          - Policy states if out 2 years or more, must re-apply
        - o Graduates who return to different programs
      - Per Alisha, KVCC policy students can only pursue one certificate/degree at a time
      - Per Mike, need to clean up "end-program" process
        - Issue re: 3+1 students applying for 2 degrees
        - 3 + 1 is not HLC approved, per Alisha
        - Sub Group to review/make recommendations re: 3+1
          - Angela (chair); Dan; Sarah; Alisha
    - FT = 24 credits for academic year (including summer)
    - PT = Apprx 67% of total enrollment
  - Dan to compile/distribute explanatory notes re: data

- o Question raised re: future direction of enrollment
  - Per Mike
    - Current model unsustainable
    - Questioned whether analysis of 5-year head count change and factors associated with change would be more realistic
    - Significant strides have been made
      - o Director of Retention-Completion position
      - o Target X
      - o Recruitment Strategies
      - New Student Orientation
        - 52% have registered by end of process
          - If student starts program FT, will likely continue FT status
      - o FYE
  - Need to educate college community re:
    - Data
    - Fact that everyone impacts enrollment-retention
    - Suggestion made to include info in orientation
  - Additional comments re: enrollment-retention
    - Review re: class schedules is in process
      - o Course offerings
      - Timing (days/time of day)
      - Programs that can be totally completed w/night courses
    - Most students work 30 hours/week
    - Investigate offerings for "undecideds"
      - Prevalent issue among high schoolers
    - Develop "next-track" classes for appropriate programs
      - o i.e. apprenticeship program would be ideal
    - Adult Learner assistance via Federal Funds previously available
    - Early Middle College
      - KVCC = 10% of enrollment
      - Kellogg = 40-50%
    - Embed presence
      - High schools
        - TRS/FYE
          - Would need to change name (?"College/Career Perspective") to facilitate financial aid; state would need to review/approve
          - Would be challenge to offer in high schools
      - Employers
    - Ask SVAC students how they were contacted

### **Communication to Waitlisted Students**

- Recent situation
  - o NSO students were waitlisted for course
  - New section was added
  - o Could not contact students directly; must have Dean's approval
- Clarification needed re: actual policy/protocol (from Sarah Hubbell)
  - Policy/protocol should be consistent across all disciplines
- Discussion re: possible need for FT schedule with 12-week classes for lowest-level classes
  - Longer in-class time beneficial for many students
  - o ? data available re: success in 12 wk v. 15 wk classes
