#### **COUNSELING AND ADVISING**

- Offering variety of appointments/drop-ins during the week of 1/18 to accommodate those students that might be contemplating dropping courses or needing to complete an appeal.
- EAA Excellence in Academic Advising
  - o Compiling the comprehensive EAA (Excellence in Academic Advising) report
  - o Retreat planned with our EAA follow, Dr. Chissy Jones for the middle of March
    - More details to follow

#### FINANCIAL AID

- Satisfactory Academic Progress ran at the end of the Fall semester
  - 16% of financial aid students were suspended for not passing any of their Fall 2021 classes
    - 20% of non-financial aid students did not receive a grade in any of their classes.
  - Still at our highest percentage suspended in the last 10 years showing the pandemic is impacting student success
    - 34% suspended FA students/35% non-financial aid students
- FAFSA 2022-2023
  - Per State of Michigan total FAFSA completions are down significantly from last year
    - 60,000 applications January to January
- Emergency Grants Awarded through December 31, 2021
  - \$9,454,950 has been awarded from HEERF funds
  - o Big thanks to IT for getting the CARES report on the website by January 10th.
- 923 Students have attended this year as part of the Reconnect program
- 1,074 Students have attended this year as part of the Futures for Frontliners program

#### INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SERVICES

- Enrollment
  - o 18 new international students (13 full-time) for the winter semester.
  - We continue to see large numbers of students defer to future semesters due to public health and travel considerations.
    - We will have a summer intake to accommodate these students.
- Entry restrictions for certain countries in southern Africa were lifted on Jan. 1.
