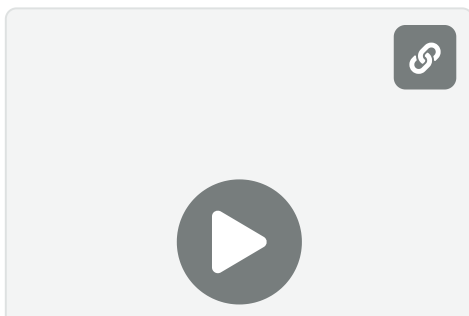

Position: Power Forward

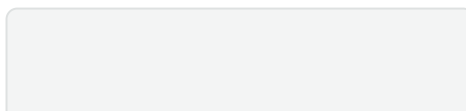
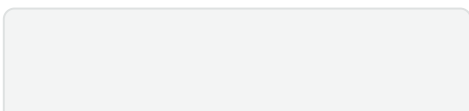
Hometown: Portage, Michigan

EDU Department Updates

- ▶ Enrollment and Retention
 - ▶ Dec. 9, 2022

Certification Changes

- 5 Grade bands
 - Birth through Kindergarten (B-K)
 - Prekindergarten (PreK) through Grade 3 (PreK-3)
 - Grades 3 through 6
 - Grades 5 through 9
 - Grades 7 through 12
- Certification changes led to Education Program changes at Colleges and Universities.
 - Changes are being progressively rolled out. Elementary changes have gone into effect first.

Evolution of Education plans at KVCC

- **Prior to Fall 2021 (and prior to TRS becoming EDU)**
 - Elementary & Special Ed programs included courses such as:
 - Art for the Elementary Teacher
 - Earth Science for the Elementary Teacher
 - Number concepts for Elementary Teacher
- **Fall 2021**
 - Elementary and Special Ed programs became very general, no longer containing classes listed above.
 - Included newer courses such as EDU 108.
 - Students were recommended to transfer before completing Associates Degree.
- **Winter/ Fall 2022**
 - To assist with the transitioning requirements (and to ensure students were not misled thinking something would transfer that ultimately would not count) KVCC suspended Elementary & Secondary Education Associate degrees.
 - Students pursuing these programs are listed under programs such as Liberal Arts or General Studies.
 - Growing list of EDU classes that will work for transfer!
 - Working on creating new Elem. Ed Associate degrees -- for both transfer and paraprofessionals heading to work!
 - Currently, recommending students transfer before completing Associates Degree with the "reverse transfer" degree completion.

What about Secondary Education?

- Major in the content area that a student plans to teach.
- WMU Only - Secondary Education is now a Master's degree.

What about Early Childhood (Birth - PK) Education?

- Students have traditionally followed Elem. Ed transfer plans or have pursued this degree elsewhere, but we are considering new degrees options in this area.

Challenges

- ▶ Classes that used to count for transfer for future educators, no longer count. This has affected enrollments and because we did not have a “central” department or Dept. Chair, messages were mixed or failed to reach everyone. **Hopefully, my role as EDU Chair will help fix this problem.**
- ▶ We have created 8 new EDU classes (7 of which are already approved for transfer). Many departments are adjusting course content and revising additional courses for transfer approval (there are 8 under-construction or review)
 - ▶ This is a heavy lift for content areas already stretched thin: namely Math and Science, **but they are working hard for our students and their work is highly appreciated!**
 - ▶ It is humbling (and sometimes annoying) to return again (and again) to our 4 year partners and ask for their “approval,” **but we are making progress and our progress is worth it.** Students are also pursuing online options for years 3 and 4.
