- II. Minutes of December 9, 2022 meeting were approved as presented; motion by N. Bergan, supported by E. Dominianni.
- III. IR Update D. Mondoux
 - Registration numbers down slightly from last week- this is peek of winter enrollment
 - o In the next few weeks we will is students drop out, highest numbers are now
 - Returning students out-number new students
 - International students are up
 - Persistence KPI Fall to net fall
 - Trends over time based on students who are new to KVCC "New to KVCC cohort"
 - Fall of 2013 through fall of 2022
 - Higher Transfers from 2019-2020
 - Stop outs remained similar during this time frame
 - Stable 55-59% still enrolled
 - Full time students' numbers where down in 2021 during the pandemic, but higher awards granted
 - Part time more influx, bouncing back in part
 - New to KVCC numbers are up, but lower awards granted
 - Unknown reasons for lower awards granted
 - Fall 2020 high transfers
 - Less people started in 2020
 - dip in numbers not loss of existing students, dip was no new students
 - Fall of 2021 also down
 - Monitoring these trends going forward
 - 2020-2021 numbers could have been affected by
 - a loss of flexible classes and loss of orientation helping to get people full time enrollment
 - Part time costs more less financial aid help
 - Keep in mind this is a small chunk of our student body
 - We have much higher returning students
 - Training students beginning with us and staying with us

- More adult students looking to obtain degree here not looking to transfer out
- These numbers where generated before final 2021 numbers came in, but the difference will be finite

• Discussion:

- o Reconnect do we know who is new to us, vs previous students?
 - will review at next meeting where we are at with Michigan reconnect
 - Are these students coming back our previous students?
 - how can we reach out to those who are looking to reconnect outside of our previous students?

 - Same factors influencing students going to college also affect them staying in college

 - o Can see correlations between KVFOCUS and influx of certain questions

VI. MI Reconnect – A. Cederberg

- 2 reconnect bills passed in December a third is being proposed
- Soon be able to implemented:
 - o students will be able to withdraw from their reconnect money
 - a year after their first semester we will be charged fees for drawing from their money
 - the third year the student will have to pay
 - this will now be a policy that follows other states, follow SAP policy
 - If you withdraw a lot will no longer be eligible
 - Student can be making satisfactory process or a 2.0
 - Allows for us to have more tools to rehab a student's
 - When we monitor it seems that students will need to earn 12 credit hours not just attempt but will have more time
 - Annual reporting will be increased significantly
 - Going to cover more things, previous Pell eligible programs only, looking to include more
 - o 12 credits in an academic year
 - Out of district students will get Pell and reconnect, this language will most likely be corrected

ADVISING AND COUNSELING

We have successfully shifted to hour-long appointments blocks Mon, Wed-Fri and to same-day appointments rather than drop-ins for Tuesday. Our goal is aim for 45-minute meeting with our students, with time for updating notes etc. This format will allow for some much needed time to create student plans in DegreeWorks and support students through their career exploration journey.

For same-day appointments students can call 269-488-4040 starting at 8am to schedule their half-hour appointment for the day. Since so many of our appointments are via phone or Zoom this allows for students to know when to expect their phone call or Zoom appointment. For students on campus, it allows them time to eat lunch or study, rather than waiting in a specific waiting area.

ENROLLMENT MANAGEMENT

Chelsie Taylor will be going to an onsite visit at Portage High School where they are going to have all their seniors fill out applications. Once this information is entered into our system then Chelsie can begin to build those necessary relationships with our future students.

Jonathan Selmon will be doing a "Get It Done" event with the Kalamazoo Promise staff at Phoenix High School the first week of March. They will help students complete their Promise applications, as well as have financial aid, KVAAP, and advising staff available to help students get ready for fall registration. We hope for this to be an eventful day at Phoenix High School.

This week our High School enrollment for winter is up 10.8% over last year. Our First time in any College enrollment is up 12.6% and our International Students are up 27% over last year. I'm very proud of the hard work that is happening in the Enrollment Management Department. We have huge goals to meet for fall, but we continue to push hard each week and are making progress. I am confident that this team will continue to prove that we can make a difference.

This Thursday the Enrollment team will be going to the FIC to learn more about the Horticulture Program so that we can push the information out into the community and help promote the program.
