 - i. We do now have enrollment report for this week, had an issue discovered with summer enrollment due to code change, and that created some issues with contact hour measurement

- b. Down in number from the first week of the semester
 - i. Reminder: the first week numbers are not a great indicator, for best we need to look at after a couple to see accurate trends
- c. Did deal with issue with high school aged 25 and older, was corrected
- d. We have summer outreach campaigns planned
 - 9,000 students that had transferred elsewhere who have expressed interest in returning or transferring to KVCC, will be doing A HARD mailing
 - ii. Guest summer semesters
 - 1. Previous years this option help to bolster summer semester numbers
 - 2. A lot of universities are offering summer classes to keep their students
 - iii. Lot of classes list faculty as staff and students have expressed they wait to see which faculty is listed instead of the staff designation
 - 1. Requirement that Faculty be listed is not the required until classes start, but we try to have it listed earlier
