



We have some very exciting news from our brewing department's faculty, staff and students. The past week has been an eventful one for the brewing department. At the U.S. Open College Beer Championship, student beers earned one Gold and two Silver Medals, and placed 4th overall.

Open College Beer Championship is for colleges and universities that teach brewing courses. Any college or university that offers courses in brewing can enter. In the fifth year of this competition, 11 schools from the United States and Canada participated.

Kalamazoo Valley Community College won a Gold medal for Pineapple Peppercorn Berliner Weiss, created by Kaelyn Aures and Mike Jones; Silver medals for Schwarzbier, made by students Kaelyn Aures and Mike Jones; My Old Friend, crafted by students Christopher Scheibel, Daniel Houvener, Jacob Miller, Tyler Rosey, Joseph Parker and Theodore Woznicki.


