






#### PTK Celebrates Fall 2022 Induction

Lacks, whose cells, taken without her consent in 1951, are still used in experiments leading to major medical breakthroughs today. Earlene McMichael, a marketing projects manager at the college, came up with the project and helped coordinate it. Alecia Cross, design assistant at the KVM, spearheaded the assembly of the associated Henrietta Lacks mini-exhibit.
