The Michigan online voter registration deadline is **TODAY**. If you have not yet registered to vote, now is a great opportunity to make sure that your voter registration status is up-to-date, so you are ready to vote in the upcoming November 2022 Election.

You can register for the first time or update your registration status right here.

The theatrical production chronicles the accomplishments and local family connections of Henrietta Lacks, whose cells taken without her consent in 1951 are still leading to major breakthroughs today.
