#### This Issue: Harmony

People with the Harmony talent look for areas of agreement. In their view, there is little to be gained from conflict and friction, so they seek to hold them to a minimum. When it is known that people hold differing views, a Harmonizer will try to find the common ground and try to steer them away from confrontation and toward harmony.

The genius of people with the Harmony talent stems from what can be seen by them and their response to what is seen. First, they can see where people can come together when they are in conflict. Often those in conflict are absolutely blind to how to resolve their conflicts because their differences seem so insurmountable. But people with the Harmony talent can often see where people in conflict could come together and resolve their differences. The second aspect of the genius is found in the way that Harmonizers work with people who are in conflict. Usually, one on one and one at a time, meeting with those in conflict and helping each person to clarify their own position and come to see the point of view of the person with whom they are in conflict. In doing so, Harmonizers help conflicting people move to reconciliation.
