Presidential Inauguration Slated for Oct. 19

The formal installation of L. Marshall Washington, Ph.D., as the third president of Kalamazoo Valley Community College will take place during a community-wide celebration scheduled for Friday, Oct. 19.

"Celebrating the Past and Creating the Future" is the theme of the inaugural activities, which will include a 4 p.m. investiture ceremony in the Dale B. Lake Auditorium of the college's Texas

Township Campus.

The ceremony will mark the beginning of both the Washington presidency and the next chapter in the college's partnerships with key collaborators and the broader community. Academic delegates and guests from around the country are expected to join Washington's extended family, community, civic, and business leaders as well as Kalamazoo Valley students, faculty, administrators and staff to officially mark the transition of leadership to the new president. more

Self-Assurance is similar to self-confidence. Those with the Self-Assurance theme have faith in their strengths. They know that they are able to take risks, able to meet new challenges, able to stake claims, and, most important, able to deliver. Self-Assurance is more than just self-confidence. When people with Self-Assurance look at the world, they know that their perspective is unique and distinct. And because no one else sees exactly what they see, they know that no one can make their decisions for them. No one can tell them what to think. They have the authority over themselves to form conclusions, make decisions, and act. No matter what the situation, you seem to know what the right decision is. This theme lends you an aura of certainty. Unlike many, you are not easily swayed by someone else's arguments, no matter how persuasive they may be.

The genius of the Self-Assurance talent begins with confidence. They have a quality that is often called resilience. This means that they can "bounce back." Accordingly, they have an attitude that no matter what happens to them; they will in fact "bounce back" and quite probably reach higher heights even if they momentarily fail. The genius here is that they not only have self-confidence, but an inner compass for deciding what needs to be done and how they need to do it.
