#LookBeyond: #BeStigmaFree Campaign Invites Kalamazoo Valley to Help Challenge Assumptions Through Art

With a table at Cougar Kickoff on Sept. 3 and an Art Hop exhibit on Sept. 6, the <u>#LookBeyond</u> campaign is partnering with the Office of Diversity and Inclusion to encourage students, instructors and staff to see all people as human beings, regardless of diagnosis.

<u>#LookBeyond: #BeStigmaFree</u> is a campaign to reduce stigma and increase understanding, support and positive attitudes toward people throughout Kalamazoo County who are living with and/or affected by mental illness, substance use disorders and disabilities. The campaign asks supporters to take a <u>pledge</u> (represented by the acronym LET'S GO) to:

- Listen to people who live with mental health, substance use and/or disability challenges, to gain understanding.
- Educate yourself about these challenges by using community resources (like taking <u>Mental Health First Aid Training</u>).
- Treat every person as a valuable member of our community.
- Speak up for fair and respectful treatment of all people.
- Get others involved with the #LookBeyond campaign.
- Optimize your own wellness.

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Congratulations to the 53 employees who completed the Next Level Customer Service Training.
