# **Career Coach Helps Students, Community Members Find Jobs**

Students and community members looking for a job now have a new tool to assist them in their job search. Career Coach, Kalamazoo Valley Community College's new online job board, matches job seekers with careers based on their personal interests and skills.

<u>Career Coach</u> is a free online tool anyone can use to explore, prepare for and find the right career.

The Career Coach assessment tool identifies a person's interests and matches those to potential career areas. Using that information and a simple keyword search, job seekers can learn about the employment prospects for a variety of careers, wage information and current job postings in the area.

According to Tracey Corbett, student employment relations liaison, the site is easy to navigate and offers a number of free resources for job seekers.

"This site is great for our students and community members," Corbett explained. "It's very user friendly and really allows the job seeker to customize his or her search based on job title, key words, education and so much more."

Those looking for employment will find career exploration tools, including a skills assessment and soft skills training as well as employment trends, salary information and a resume builder. Additionally, students can search for part-time and full-time internship and apprenticeship opportunities.

Career Coach not only connect students with jobs but also to Kalamazoo Valley's guided pathways and programs of study – helping them map their educational journey so they achieve their career goals.

# **Unique Partnership Impacts Student Health**

Thirty-two students enrolled in wellness and physical education (WPE) and exercise science classes have partnered with medical assistant technology (MAT) students for a detailed blood analysis in hopes of improving their overall health and well-being.

"It's a voluntary program allowing students some tangible data that impacts their overall health and well-being," explained Joe Brady, WPE faculty. "The students volunteer for a blood analysis, completed by our MAT students, at the start of the of their WPE class. After talking about good nutritional habits, exercise routines, effective weight management and other pertinent information, the students then have the opportunity to apply the information they have learned in their class to improve their overall health and well-being." more

#### **Respiratory Award**

Jennifer Crosby, a second year respiratory care practitioner student at Kalamazoo Valley, received a \$2,000 award from the Lambda Beta Society and an additional \$750 to attend the society's International Congress meeting in New Orleans in November.

To be considered for the award, Crosby submitted a letter of recommendation from RCP instructor Megan VanDonselaar and also created an asthma and COPD educational presentation.

She was recognized as a 2019 award winner during the Lambda Beta reception on Nov. 9 in New Orleans. Henry Oh, president of Lambda Beta Society's executive board congratulated Crosby by saying, "Students like you are the hope and future of respiratory care. Please never give up your quest for excellence."
