How do I market my program to students? I know there's a link and tutorial on this, but I don't know where to start! If you've ever asked these types of questions, this session on Campus Tools and Resources is for you. Learn how to request assistance with facilities, IT, AV/Media, marketing, event coordination, and room reservation needs. You'll get a general overview of the requesting process for various tasks around campus and have an opportunity to do hands-on training with specific requesting software, including Astra Schedule, Dude Solutions, WorkZone, IT Ticketing System, and the AV/Media request form.

Become a Corrections Officer in Just Four Weeks

The Kalamazoo Valley Law Enforcement Training Center at Kalamazoo Valley Community College is offering a four-week-long Corrections Officer Academy that runs from Feb. 17 to March 13 to help fill the growing number of open corrections positions in state prisons. Classes are held from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Monday through Friday at the Groves Campus.

The Corrections Officer Academy is a Michigan Sheriffs Coordinating and Training Councilapproved, 160-hour certification program for correctional personnel supervising inmates in county jails. The average starting salary is \$35,849 while highly experienced workers can earn as much as \$53,306. <u>more</u>

Career Coach is a free online tool anyone can use to explore, prepare for and find the right career. It can be found at www.kvcc.emsicc.com.

The Career Coach assessment tool identifies a person's interests and matches those to potential career areas. Using that information and a simple keyword search, job seekers can learn about the employment prospects for a variety of careers, wage information and current job postings in the area.

Those looking for employment will find career exploration tools, including a skills assessment and soft skills training as well as employment trends, salary information and a resume builder. Additionally, students can search for part-time and full-time internship and apprenticeship opportunities.
