Helpful Tips for Recording Video

- 1. Use your smartphone and check to make sure your front/rear facing camera is set to record in 4K or 1080p at 30fps (Go to Settings > Photos & Camera > Record Video to change settings)
- 2. Record in landscape or portrait.
- 3. Avoid having a bright light behind you like a window, as this can make your face appear dark. Instead, face a light source so that you are illuminated.
- 4. Find a relatively quiet place where you can record your video. Here's an <u>example</u> from Aubrey Jewel Rogers.
- 5. Record and post your message with #Wewill to social media now! Re-post again on April 26!

Class Withdrawal with Tuition Credit

Due to challenges of COVID-19, Kalamazoo Valley has also temporarily altered the withdrawal policy for Winter Semester 2020 classes.

Students can complete the Winter Semester 2020 Withdrawal and Tuition Credit Appeal Form to

withdraw from a class and apply for the credit. The credit can be used to take any class(es) within the next year.

The form is available under My Links in MyValley.

College Waives Online Course Fees for Summer Semester

Kalamazoo Valley is waiving online course fees for the Summer 2020 semester. Students who have already paid summer tuition and fees will have the online course fees refunded. Refunds will be processed as follows:

- Fees paid by credit card will be refunded to the original credit card
- Fees paid by cash or check will be refunded with a check. Checks will be mailed to student addresses on file
- Fees paid using the payment plan will result in future payment plan amounts being adjusted to account for the lower overall semester balance remaining

Credit card refunds have already been processed, but may take some time to be reflected on your credit card statement. Checks for cash/check payments will be processed and mailed on Friday, April 17.

Faculty Members Manufacturing Masks, Face Shields







Since the onset of COVID-19 struck our country and state, the need for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) has continued to grow more urgent every day. As a result, Kalamazoo Valley Community College faculty members Dave Brock and Bill Kring began exploring ways to create masks and face shields using the college's CNC machines and 3D printers.

Brock and Kring have been working diligently in the Engineering Design and Manufacturing Technology (EDMT) lab to design, manufacture and assemble face masks and shields based on a design received from a major 3D manufacturer, Stratasys. Both men are EDMT faculty members and department co-chairs. more

Families First Coronavirus Response Act

As you may be aware, recent legislation was passed intended to help workers and employers related to the COVID-19 pandemic. The legislation, the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA), became effective April 1, 2020 and will remain in place through December 31, 2020. Some of the benefits are as follows:

- Full-time employees may be eligible for Emergency Paid Sick Leave of up to 80 hours, in addition, to leave that has already been provided to those who are unable to work for reasons related to COVID-19
- Part-time employees may be eligible for Emergency Paid Sick Leave of up to their average hours worked in a two week period in addition to any leave that has already been provided to those who are unable to work for reasons related to COVID-19*
- The FFCRA also expands the Family Medical Leave Act by widening eligibility and providing partial compensation for leave time related to COVID-19

If you need to request either of these two new types of leave, please submit the appropriate request form to Susan Matlis. * Hours will be calculated upon approval of the request. If the employee's schedule varies significantly, a sixmonth average will be used to calculate the average hours worked for a two-week period

Important Financial Aid Information

Students should let the Financial Aid office know if they are planning on enrolling in the summer semester. Students can complete the <u>Summer Intent Form</u> and email it to <u>finaid@kvcc.edu</u>.

Students should also submit their <u>2020-2021 FAFSA</u> if not already completed. The office began notifying students via email of their 2020-2021 Financial Aid Award Offers on March 23, 2020. The office will continue to process and award for the 2020-2021 school year.

Students who received a notification of an award should log into their MyValley account using the following steps to see what is needed to complete to qualify for the award:

- Visit <u>MyValley</u>
- · Choose Financial Aid Information (under My Links)
- Choose My Award Information
- · Choose Award By Aid Year
- Select Aid Year
- Review your Financial Aid Checklist and/or Select "Award Overview"
