In my recent communication dated March 10, 2021, I told you that the college would provide updated COVID-19 (Coronavirus) vaccination information as it became available and I am writing to remind you about the recent announcement from Kalamazoo County Health and Community Services.

KALAMAZOO COUNTY HEALTH AND COMMUNITY SERVICES EXPANDS VACCINE ELIGIBILITY AND SCHEDULING PLAN

Adults age 50 and older now include anyone age 50 or older with or without a medical condition.

The health department will no longer have a pre-registration waitlist form for this newly eligible age group. Rather, beginning today, every Monday the health department will release available vaccination appointments for the following week. Eligible adults should visit the health department's <u>website</u>.

Vaccine appointments will be posted on the website directly when appointments become available for self-scheduling. This new process will operate on a first come, first serve basis. If no appointments are shown, then no appointments are available for self-scheduling that week.

People with limited internet access are encouraged to call the COVID-19 Call Center at 269.373.5200 for assistance in scheduling an appointment. Please reserve the option of calling for those who cannot access the website.

Caregivers of individuals with special needs include: caregiver family members and guardians age 16 and over of children with special healthcare needs, including physical, developmental, mental, sensory, behavioral, cognitive, or emotional impairment or limiting condition that requires medical management, healthcare intervention and/or use of specialized services or programs. The condition may be congenital developmental, or acquired through disease, trauma, or environmental cause and may impose limitations in performing daily self-maintenance activities or substantial limitations in a major life activity.

Caregivers of individuals with special needs can now pre-register on the waitlist form.

Adults over the age of 65 and living in Kalamazoo County will continue to be prioritized for vaccination, if they have not already received it. The health department will reserve special appointment slots at upcoming clinics so those over the age of 65 may have assurance that they will continue to receive opportunities for vaccination. If you are in the 65 and older and have not

yet received the COVID-19 vaccine and wish to do so, call the health department's COVID-19 Call Center at 269-373-5200.

All eligible residents are also encouraged to explore vaccination through other vaccine providers in the area, including Meijer Pharmacy and Rite Aid Pharmacies.

Title IX Training Information

On Friday, March 19, 2021, employees should participate in a training about Title IX. The 90minute session will be available via Zoom beginning at 9 a.m. The program will be presented in cooperation with the law firm of Miller Canfield and will be recorded for access later for those unable to view the live event.

Title IX applies to any institution receiving federal financial assistance from the Department of Education, including state and local educational agencies, including Kalamazoo Valley Community College.

Kalamazoo Valley Community College's Title IX policy states that: "Members of the college community, guests and visitors have the right to be free from all forms of gender and sex-based discrimination including sexual harassment and acts of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual exploitation, stalking and other conduct of a sexual nature that is so severe, pervasive and objectively offensive that it effectively denies a person equal access to the college's education programs and activities."

CNM Hosts Student Fine Art Show in April

The Center for New Media will host the Student Fine Art Show during the month of April. Digital entries will be accepted for consideration until 5 p.m. on March 26, 2021. This is a juried art competition and not all entries will be accepted into the show. All accepted entries will be displayed on the CNM's Facebook and Instagram accounts.

Any Kalamazoo Valley Community College student enrolled between September 2020 and May 2021 is eligible to participate. Each student may submit a maximum of two pieces of artwork that has been completed within the past two years.

Students will need to provide work as high-resolution digital images for this virtual show. While there won't be a public opening reception, students whose work is selected can still drop off physical work for the display in the Arcus Gallery and CNM Central Gallery. All physical 2D artwork must be framed and ready for hanging with proper wire and hooks. Clip frames are not allowed. Improperly presented works will not be displayed. Works on stretched canvas do not need frames, but the sides must be clean craftsmanship.

Due to Coronavirus concerns, the Center for New Media will not be open for Art Hop on Friday, April 2, but students may choose to drop off their art to be displayed.

Awards will be given to Best of Show, First, Second, and Third Place.

The categories are: Drawing - Color Drawing - Black and White Painting - Oil, Acrylic, Alkyd Watercolor Film Photography Sculpture Ceramics Mixed Media

All work must be emailed to <u>Cindy Parks</u> by March 26 by 5 p.m. Each entry must be accompanied by an entry form. Entries should include a completed call for entry form or the following information: your name, address, phone number, Valley ID number, title of work, and price (if applicable).

Drop-off and pick-up of all artwork is the responsibility of the student or their representative. The Juror reserves the right to eliminate any piece or move to a more appropriate category. Kalamazoo Valley Community College, the Art Department, Student Services, or anyone involved in the sponsoring of the show, do not assume any responsibility for entries lost or damaged during the show.


Student-Made Beer for Sale
