2022-2023 Tuition Rates Announced

During its scheduled meeting on April 12, the Kalamazoo Valley Community College Board of Trustees approved the following tuition and fees for the 2022-2023 academic year effective for the fall semester:

In-District - \$120 per contact hour
Out-of-District - \$207 per contact hour
Out-of-State - \$276 per contact hour
International - \$313 per contact hour

The following non-refundable student fee and non-refundable usage fee shall be charged:

- Student fee of \$158 per semester (applicable to all students registering for courses)
- Usage fee (applicable only to those students using specific services/programs):
 - \$200 per contact hour fee for students enrolling in the same class more than three times

During its regularly scheduled meeting on April 12, the Kalamazoo Valley Community College Board of Trustees approved a resolution recognizing April as Community College Month.

Together with the nearly 1,000 other community colleges across the country, Kalamazoo Valley is celebrating Community College Month in April. 






Last Taps on Tuesday is April 26
