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DID YOU KNOW?



The Kalamazoo Valley Museum is operated by Kalamazoo Valley Community College and governed by its Board of Trustees, which means every time you visit the museum in person or access its virtual programs, you are also visiting the college!

From its beginning in 1881 as a collection of curiosities in the public library basement, the museum has always been a tax-funded museum. Until 1984, the museum remained a department of the Kalamazoo Public Library. From 1984 to 1991, the museum received its operating support from the Kalamazoo City School District. In 1991, the museum became part of Kalamazoo Valley Community College and gained the support of the community through a charter millage.

In February 1996, the current 60,000 square foot facility was opened on the college's Arcadia Commons Campus. It was funded by a \$19.6 million private capital campaign that included contributions ranging from \$10 to \$4.5 million.

In cooperation with the college, museum staff work to develop cultural, historical and scientific literacy through innovative exhibits, special exhibitions, planetarium programs, educational programs and family events. As a point of pride, the museum is accredited by the American Alliance of Museums.



On May 13 at 7 p.m., Cory Barrett, co-director of Kalamazoo Valley Community College's culinary arts program and the 2019 Food Network Spring Baking Champion, will team up with college President L. Explore Mysterious, Mythical Creatures and Elegant Hats and Headdresses at the Museum This Summer

Giants, Dragons and Unicorns Come to the **Kalamazoo Valley Museum This Summer**

June 15 - Sept 12

Giants, Dragons & Unicorns: The World of Mythic Creatures, on display at the Kalamazoo Valley Museum from June 15 to September 12, features unique cultural objects to highlight the surprising similarities and differences in the ways people around the world envision and depict mythic creatures.

The exhibition includes models and cast fossils of prehistoric animals to investigate how they could have — through misidentification, speculation, fear or imagination — inspired the development of several legendary creatures.

There are also numerous interactive stations throughout the

exhibition. Visitors can rearrange scale models of mammoth bones to look like a human skeleton, digitally build their own dragon and watch it come alive in a virtual environment, as well as have an opportunity to take a fun photo with three dragons.

Kalamazoo Valley Museum **Director Bill McElhone** said the exhibit should be the perfect summertime

diversion. "The exhibit will have wide appeal, especially for those interested in learning more about how real marine animals were mistaken for sea monsters," McElhone said. "It will provide some insight and background on how these mythical creatures came to be in so many of the world's cultures. The exhibit is visually stimulating as well. It's a great escape."

The Global Language of Headwear: Cultural Identity, Rites of Passage, and Spirituality

July 17-Oct 24

The museum will host the exhibit The Global Language of Headwear: Cultural Identity, Rites of Passage, and Spirituality from July 17 to October 24.

Perched atop the most prominent part of the body, hats announce where we live, who we are, what we believe and where we fit into our communities. This exhibition brings into brilliant focus the differences and similarities that define countries and cultures.

This exhibition takes the viewer on a journey around the world. The Global Language of Headwear: Cultural Identity, Rites of Passage, and Spirituality presents 89 hats and headdresses carefully selected from a private collection consisting of more than 1,300 pieces of international headwear. From beliefs and traditions to gender roles and social status, headwear is the guide. Beyond their aesthetic properties, the hats reinforce cultural ties and, in doing so, provide a sense of who we are and how we fit into the world.

"This exhibit is a visually stunning and culturally rich gathering of hats and headdresses from 42 countries across Asia, Africa, Europe, the Middle East, and North and South America," said Kalamazoo Valley Museum Director Bill McElhone. "The exhibit demonstrates how culture, creativity and skills went into the creation of each piece. Through these amazing pieces of art, visitors will explore many world cultures."

The Global Language of Headwear: Cultural identity, Rites of Passage, and Spirituality is jointly organized and toured by Stacey W. Miller and International Arts & Artists.
